Guidelines

- ◆ Begin your boast with the following information:
 - Your full name
 - Your parent(s) name(s) and their profession
 - Where you are from and/or where you live
- ◆ End your boast by stating what your next great act will be
- ◆ Include the following elements of Anglo-Saxon poetry:
 - No end-rhyme
 - Heavy alliteration (underline the alliteration)
 - 3 original kennings (circle the kennings)
 - Formal and grand tone
- ◆ Minimum length: 12 lines
